Dear Mr. Chairman:

This responds to your May 7, 2013, letter inquiring about the U.S. Office of Government Ethics' (OGE) efforts to implement the Stop Trading on Congressional Knowledge Act of 2012 (STOCK Act) (Pub. L.112-105, as amended), and is OGE's fourth quarterly spending report on activities related to developing the electronic financial disclosure filing system (e-filing) required by Section 11(b) of the Act.

During the period since OGE provided you with its third quarterly report on January 23, 2014, we have continued to work diligently to develop the system. From January through March 2014, the contractors completed three more significant development phases. Most importantly, the system has nearly complete filer functionality, which allowed us to conduct agency focus group testing in January, February and March 2014. The contractors have now moved into developing reviewer functionality, and we anticipate that system development activities generally will move forward at a more brisk pace.

The table below captures the expenditures associated with the described activities through the second quarter of fiscal year 2014.
