Dear Chairman Levin and Chairman Skelton:

In anticipation of the conference on H.R. 1585, the "National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2008," the Office of Government Ethics respectfully submits for your consideration its views on Section 863 of the Senate version of the bill.

The Office of Government Ethics supports Section 863 of H.R. 1585, as passed by the Senate, but recommends that additional information be gathered for this report. Section 863 would require the Comptroller General to submit a report to the Committees on Armed Services of the Senate and the House of Representatives on the internal ethics programs of major defense contractors. The Office of Government Ethics suggests that the Comptroller General also should report the extent to which the major defense contractors' internal ethics programs include: (1) disclosure of personal financial interests and outside employment by key personnel performing work for the Government; (2) conflict mitigation measures for addressing any personal conflicts of interest of employees in connection with their work on Department of Defense contracts; and (3) procedures for reporting these personal conflicts of interest and any mitigation measures to the Department of Defense. These additional data would be useful in determining to what extent contractors' internal ethics programs are comparable to those in the executive branch.
